
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Lord Shri Ram and Shri Hanuman

Lord Shri Ram and Shri Hanuman



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Questioner: Is it true that Lord Ram was known as

maryada (staying within the boundaries of decency, good character) purushottam (supreme among men) and Lord Krishna was a purna purushottam (Absolute Supreme Being)?

Dadashri: Truly speaking Lord Ram is a purnapurushottam as he has attained moksha (fully liberated). Lord Ram has become parmatma (Absolute Self)

From time immemorial whenever the muda purush (Enlightened person) is present, like Lord Mahavir, Lord Krishna, Lord Ram, they bring together people of diverse opinions from different religions and they unify them in the one religion of the Self. Over time when the muda purush are no longer present, gradually differences of opinion arise in the world and different religious sects are formed. As a result people lose their inner peace and happiness.

In their entire lives Lord Krishna never once said that he is Vaishnav or that his religion is Vaishnav, Lord Mahavir has never said that he is Jain and that his religion is Jainism, and Lord Rama has never said that his religion is that of Sanatan. Each of them talked about realizing the Soul and achieving moksha (final liberation); As Lord Krishna did in the Gita, as the Tirthankars did in the Agams and as Sage Vashishta told Lord Rama in the Yoga Vashishta. Jeev (worldly beings) are in a state of ignorance about the Self. Shiv (Liberated being) is the embodiment of salvation. After receiving the Knowledge of the Self that person becomes Shiv. Shiv does not refer to one specific person.

63 Shalakha Purusho

Shalakha Purusho are the best of those who are worthy of going to moksha (liberation). Others will also go to moksha but these men are extraordinary because they achieve great glory and then go to moksha. These includes the 24 Tirthankars (the absolutely enlightened Lords who can liberate others) and 12 Chakravartis (King of kings). Then Vasudevs (Those who have evolved from being an ordinary human into becoming God), Prativasudevs (rivals of Vasudev) and Balrams (the righteous elder brothers of the Vasudevs. Balram and Vasudev are always step brothers).

Lord Ramis known as a Balram, Laxman is known as a Vasudev and Ravan is known as a Prativasudev.


Mother Sita's chastity









And most important... at a young age I received the priceless opportunity for service to saints and gurus, all because of the exile. This exile was an auspicious blessing for me resulting from your worship.

"Oh Hanuman! What are you doing? Look at the state of this valuable necklace? What is this madness?"


"Mother! Please be calm. Please listen to me," said

Seeing Hanuman's devotion for Ram, Sitaji was surprised for a moment and was also satisfied.




Significance of Sindoor

He thinks of a way to respect his devotee's sense of duty.


"Until Hanuman keeps clicking, I will keep on yawning. I will also stay awake the whole night like Hanuman."

She informs Mother Kaushalya who calls Vashishth Muni and explains to him


