

If we get angry at a person, he will be hurt and will want revenge on us. And so, we will have to meet him again in our


Anger is a weakness. A person without weaknesses has a commanding presence. Even if they say something ordinary, everyone would immediately agree.


When one gets angry then one's hands and legs start to tremble. The body is warning us that this behaviour is unbecoming (does not suit us).







