


the main dancer even though he knows that you're a better dancer than him!"

Rishi before he left.


Rishi knew that the dance couldn't be performed without him because three dancers were required in all the steps. But Akul and Sahil were now fed-up of having to convince him all the time.

Truly, Sahil and Akul didn't realise how soon the ceremonious day would arrive. In a flash, the day had arrived. Rishi was sitting in the audience,







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Find the number that goes in each empty circle below.




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Find these items inside the picture below.



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
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

The fairy sprinkled sparkling fairy dust on both of them, and they started floating up without any wings. The fairy was



"Grassy, we didn't tell Lily!" whispered Rosie.


"But we didn't have time to tell her," said Grassy.
