
too will be drawn to the one of a kind, Shree Simandhar








As soon as the spaceship was airborne Kashmi said with excitement, "WOAH! I am flying the spaceship sooo fast."



Dada lovingly replied...



Seeing His face Kashmi exclaimed, "Wow, Bhagwan looks so divine!





Dada continued, "Look here, now Bhagwan has become as old as you. He is playing games with other children. Do you know who His friends are?"


Shaking her head Kashmi replied, "No, I don't know. Who are they?"

Kashmi said with surprise, "Oh wow, this is something entirely new! Alas! If only these celestial gods came to play with me too..."




Inquisitively Kashmi asked, "But does Bhagwan remember everything He is taught?"




Dada said, "Bhagwan's height is 500 dhanushya, which is over 3000 feet. In fact His nose alone is 100 feet."







Kashmi inquisitively asked, "What does Bhagwan do after attaining keval gnan?"

Dada answered saying, "After Bhagwan attains keval gnan the celestial gods set up a samovasaran which is the religious assembly of a Tirthankar Bhagwan. A samovasaran is made up of three levels. Each level has four gates.

- The first level is made up of silver. Arrangements are made within this level to keep vehicles and horses.
- The second level is made up of gold. Animals and birds are found here.
- The third level is made up of precious gems. Seated within this level are sadhus, sadhvis, ganadharo, kings and emperors, celestial gods and goddesses and ordinary humans. In the middle of this level is the Ashoka tree. Behind Bhagwan is a bhavmandal and above Him is a three tiered canopy providing shade. Bhagwan faces the east direction and celestial gods create a reflection of Bhagwan facing the other three directions. In this way, Bhagwan's face can be seen from all directions and no-one has a view of His back. This is called the chaumukhi state.

Seated on the throne, Bhagwan gives deshna. Bhagwan's speech is called deshna and it flows constantly for the salvation of people."







Dada said to Kashmi, "Now let me show you a scene that will not only surprise you but also make you very happy.

- Trees bend over and provide shade. Thorns turn upside down on their own, so that Bhagwan does not get hurt by them.
- Wherever Bhagwan sets His foot, a lotus flower appears underneath to protect His foot.
- Celestial gods and goddesses fan Him with silver fans."

Bhagwan's hair, moustache-beard, nails, and body hair do not grow. - Wherever Bhagwan goes there is an abundance of fruits from all seasons. - There are no diseases or illnesses up to 500 jojan around Him. - There is no epidemic of insects, rodents or vermin. - Millions of gods and goddesses are always at Bhagwan's service.


Upon seeing this, Kashmi stared without a blink. She thought in her mind, "Tirthankar Bhagwan's are this extraordinary!"




Seeing how incredible Bhagwan is, Kashmi had a question, "How did Simandhar Swami Bhagwan become a Tirthankar?"

Kashmi was extremely pleased to hear this response and thought, "What a beautiful intention!"





Hearing the prayer Kashmi was touched and her eyes welled up with tears.


She said, "Yes, I will definitely pray to Him."
