I used to spend all my time with papers. Dada told me that if I interact with other living people, then I will develop street-smarts. Dealing with papers is theoretical and if we interact with living people, it will make a big difference. If I wasn't working directly with machines, then I was working with papers.

While dealing with a living person, if they lie and we become upset, then that is not called street-smart. But to know how to handle a person who lies is called street-smart. Being street-smart is when we don't lose our balance and we take an adjustment with the other person. A theoretical person will say, "He is lying. He has to follow the system." He will end up cancelling such a person. He won't know how to delete such a person. That is called being unfit.

One should know how to take adjustments in any situation. This means he knows how to adjust to hot weather, cold weather, different types of food, different types of people, different types of situations, traveling in a crowded train where he may get pushed or showed. He will also know how to deal with sitting in an air-conditioned train. He may have to travel by bus or walk. He may need to reach Mumbai and the train may be out of service, but he will know how to get there. He won't get confused in any situation. The one who doesn't get confused has streetsmarts.
